Differences in Language

Monica Jones (Assistant Language Teacher)

When I came to work in Japan as an English teacher in a public high school, I knew that I would have to adjust to cultural differences. But what came as the biggest surprise was the difference in the way language is used.

When I first came to Japan, I could not speak any Japanese, and I didn't know anybody. I missed my family and my friends back home. Luckily, I was assigned to teach in a school in a small town. There were almost no foreigners living there, so I often felt that people were staring at me, which made me self-conscious. But soon everyone in my neighborhood knew who I was, and they would smile and say, "Ohayo gozaimasu," which means "Good morning," or "Konnichiwa," which means "Hello."

I learned Japanese very slowly. It was really hard because the grammar is so different from English grammar. In fact, that made me a better teacher because I could sympathize with the students' difficulties in learning English. But at the school I spoke English with the English teachers. Their English was very good, but some of the things they said to me confused me. For instance, every time we finished a class, one of the teachers would say, "You must be tired." At first, this irritated me because I thought the teacher meant that I seemed sleepy in class or that I wasn't working hard enough. I didn't know what to say to him.

Then one day, I heard that teacher say, "Otsukaresama," to another teacher as she was going home for the day. I asked him what that meant. He told me it meant, "You must be tired," which made me even more

confused. "Is this teacher rude to everyone?" I wondered. Luckily, another English teacher was in the teachers' room. When she heard the conversation and saw the confused look on my face, she explained that in Japan when someone finishes work for the day or finishes teaching a class, it is considered polite to say, "Otsukaresama," to thank them for their efforts.

I suddenly realized that Japanese say "Otsukaresama" when Americans would say "Good job." Later, I learned that before an important sports match or exam, Japanese say, "Gambatte kudasai," which means, "Do your best," instead of "Good luck." I think Japanese people focus on how hard everyone works, which is a good thing, but sometimes I want to be told I did a good job!

In English class, you are writing an essay on a topic related to writing by hand. This is your most recent draft. You are now working on improvements based on comments from your teacher.

Writing by Hand

These days, everyone is interested in finding ways to study more efficiently and improve their memories. However, instead of trying to find an AI program or some other new method to help you, the best solution may be to go back to an older way of doing things, namely, writing by hand. In fact, more and more studies are finding that one of the most effective ways to improve your ability to understand and remember things is to take notes by hand instead of by typing them.

This may seem strange because most students can type much faster than they can write by hand, so they can record much more information on their computers than they can by writing in a notebook. (1) Scientists have found that when people write by hand, more areas of the brain become active, because you concentrate on creating the unique shape of each letter. By contrast, typing involves just the same, simple motion to type any letter.

Because you cannot write down everything you hear, you have to decide what is important enough to write down. As you do this, you think about what the teacher said and how it relates to other things you have learned. This helps you to understand things more deeply as you are taking notes, and this extra focus helps the information to stay in your head. In addition, when you review your notes, (2) it is more important to read things that you have written down than words in a book or on a screen.

Studies have also shown that students come up with better ideas when they write essays by hand than when they compose them on a computer. This may be because they are forced to write more slowly, so they choose their words or think about their ideas more carefully. It could also be because ⁽³⁾they feel more relaxed when they use their hand to move the pen across the paper. Whatever the reason, it is worth trying.

In conclusion, if you want to get higher scores on tests or improve your essay-writing skills, it would be a good idea to try writing things by hand whenever possible instead of always typing on your laptop or taking pictures with your phone of the things you want to remember. In the modern world, we spend too much time looking at screens, anyway. (4)
