Your group is preparing a poster presentation entitled "The Real Macbeth" using information from an article you found on the Internet.

Most native speakers of English have heard of Shakespeare's play "Macbeth." Many students study it in high school or college, and it has been made into movies with famous actors playing the role of the evil Macbeth, who becomes king of Scotland by murdering King Duncan. In Shakespeare's play, while King Duncan is staying in Macbeth's house as his guest, Macbeth murders him in his sleep. But is this what really happened?

Shakespeare wrote the play sometime around 1604, shortly after King James of Scotland became the king of England. Shakespeare bases his story on real historical figures. King Macbeth of Scotland really did kill King Duncan in the year 1040, and King Macbeth was eventually defeated in battle by Duncan's son, but Shakespeare changed the story to make it more dramatic and to please King James. For example, King James was very interested in witches, so the play begins with three witches telling Macbeth that he will become king. In general, Shakespeare just wanted to tell a good story that would entertain the audience. He didn't care very much about what had actually happened nearly six centuries earlier. He was not a historian. He was a creative writer and also a businessman who wanted to sell as many tickets as possible to his plays, including "Macbeth."

So what do we know about the real Macbeth? You may be surprised to hear that in reality he did not murder King Duncan in his sleep. Instead, Macbeth went to war with Duncan in the year 1040, killing him in battle. Then Macbeth traveled to the Scottish capital of Scone and was crowned king. In the Shakespeare play, Macbeth is haunted by the ghost of Duncan, and he is only king for a year before he is killed by Duncan's son. However, the real life of Macbeth is very different. To begin with, the real Macbeth was born in Alba, Scotland around 1005, which was the year in which his grandfather became king of Scotland. He became king when he was about 35 years old and ruled Scotland effectively for 17 years. Under his leadership, Scotland was peaceful and prosperous. In fact, in 1050, King Macbeth traveled to Rome because he was invited by Pope Leo IX. He had to travel for months, so he must have been confident that his kingdom was safe.

However, at that time in Scottish history, various groups of men were constantly fighting each other. Scottish leaders killed each other, Vikings

attacked the northern coasts of Scotland, and the English were constantly invading from the south. Eventually, Duncan's son Malcolm led an army into Scotland. He was accompanied by English lords, who helped him to defeat Macbeth in 1054. They were not able to kill Macbeth, so the conflict continued for 3 more years. On August 15, 1057, Macbeth was killed in battle, and finally, almost a year later, Duncan's son Malcolm became the king of Scotland.

Some people prefer fact to fiction, but I think that Shakespeare's plays teach us a lot more than what actually happened in history. Shakespeare turns simple stories into psychological thrillers in which people commit terrible crimes and then shows us how their guilt gradually drives them crazy. He makes us think about the consequences of selfish actions. That is why his plays are still popular all around the world!







Japan's population is expected to shrink by about one-third over the next 50 years. According to data collected by the Japanese government, the percentage of people who are 70 years old or older has already reached 20%. On top of this, Japanese people live longer than people in almost any other country in the world. This means that the demand for nursing care for the elderly is growing rapidly. Another problem facing Japan is its extremely low birthrate. This has led to labor shortages in all sectors of the economy. The situation is even worse in nursing care, especially in rural areas. Why is nursing care so unpopular as a career choice? Though the average monthly wage was only about 220,000 yen for full-time workers, the work is demanding both physically and psychologically. Many patients need to be lifted out of bed or helped to

stand or walk. And as senile dementia becomes more common, patients must be watched carefully; otherwise, they may wander off and get lost. Health care workers must be patient and gentle when dealing with elderly people in their care

#### Source B

A study conducted in nursing homes found that many nursing care workers think it is useful to utilize robots in nursing homes. The study surveyed about 1,000 nursing care workers across the country. The graph below shows the percentage of tasks that can be done by robots, either robots or staff, or staff.

B You are learning about popular foods around the world. You are going to read the following article to understand how curry became a popular dish in Japan.

If you ask Japanese people to name some of their favorite foods, you might be surprised to hear them mention "curry and rice." You might be even more surprised to hear that they consider it a Japanese dish. In fact, one survey of almost 10,000 people listed curry as a "national food of Japan" and reported that most people eat it several times per month, more frequently than they eat sushi or tempura. It is the most popular dish on the national school lunch menu, and most Japanese mothers cook their own special versions of this comfort food. But the curry served over rice, often with a deep-fried pork cutlet, is quite different from the curry and naan bread that is popular in many Western countries.

Japanese curry does share its origins with Indian curry, but it has evolved over time into a uniquely Japanese dish. According to popular legend, a British sailor who had been shipwrecked was picked up by a Japanese fishing boat, and the sailor introduced curry to Japan. While this story is almost definitely fiction, it was most likely British sailors that brought curry with them from India after Commodore Perry and the "Black Ships" forced Japan to open to the world again after centuries of self-imposed isolation. It was served on British Navy ships during the 19th century, and it later became a popular dish for the Japanese Navy because it was easy to make in large quantities.

The first recipes for "curry and rice" which appeared in Japanese cookbooks in the late 19th century were very similar to curry recipes in British cookbooks. Japanese chefs began using a French roux and substituting yuzu juice for lemon juice. At first, it was served in restaurants in Tokyo as an expensive, foreign food, but by the early 20th century cheap curry powders and later solid-block curry mixes were being sold in Japan. Originally, it was considered a spicy dish, suitable for eating in hot weather because the spices stimulate your appetite and make you sweat, which helps you to feel cooler.

But gradually, it became a milder, sweeter dish which was popular with children. Dr. William Clark, who helped to establish the Sapporo Agricultural College, is said to have added potatoes to Japanese curry. The meat, potatoes and carrots which are usually included in the sauce make it a nutritious meal for everyone from children to members of the military.

Even though Japanese people list curry and rice as their second favorite dish, with sushi ranking first, ramen third, and tempura far below, foreigners list sushi first, ramen second, tempura third and don't list curry and rice as a Japanese food at all. One Japanese owner of a popular restaurant in New York thinks that Americans will come to love Japanese curry and rice if they have a chance to try it. He plans to add a version of his mother's own recipe to the menu of his newly opened restaurant. Maybe curry with a pork cutlet will be the next big trend in America!
